IMPORTANCE OF CITIZEN-ONLY VOTING IN VIRGINIA

WE MUST ENSURE THAT ONLY U.S. CITIZENS ARE ALLOWED TO VOTE

- The U.S. electoral system is designed to give every eligible U.S. citizen in every state a say in choosing our leaders at the federal, state, and local levels.
- The federal National Voter Registration Act requires that states take steps to ensure that only eligible citizens are registered to vote.
- Due to the failure of the Biden-Harris Administration to secure the border, states must work even harder to ensure that their elections are not compromised by illegal aliens casting votes.
- Over 12 million illegal aliens, including known “gotaways,” have entered the country since 2021.
- Further, the Biden-Harris Administration issued Executive Order 14019, directing all federal agencies to register voters, including many federal agencies that interact regularly with illegal aliens.
- These unprecedented efforts put even more responsibility on states to protect the integrity of their elections.

BY THE NUMBERS

- Virginia is home to at least 275,000 illegal aliens, but this number does not account for the major influx of the last 3 years.
- Virginia has a population of **8,631,393**.
- 275,000 illegal aliens represent 3.186% of Virginia’s population. Though this seems a small fraction, it’s enough to make a difference in close elections.
 - During the 2016 presidential race, Virginia was decided by just **212,030 votes**.
 - The gubernatorial race in Virginia in 2021 was determined by just **63,688 votes**.

VIRGINIA MUST TAKE STEPS TO ENSURE ONLY CITIZENS VOTE

- State legislators should pass legislation that ensures only U.S. citizens are voting using the America First model policy.
- State election officials should conduct regular voter roll maintenance for transparency and accountability.
- Voters should elect and appoint public officials who understand the importance of this issue.
